

FUNDING NEWS

COVID-19 STABILITY FUND TO SUPPORT CHARITIES AND COMMUNITY GROUPS

This €35m grant COVID-19 Stability fund will provide once-off grants towards operational and overhead costs such as rent, utilities, (excluding salaries). Read the press release here.

There are 24 categories of services that are targeted by this support package. Including: Youth, Social Housing, Education, support for disadvantaged communities, Social Services, Family Support Services, etc.

€5M INNOVATE TOGETHER FUND

The first round of applications for the Innovate Together Fund opened on Wednesday, 13th May 2020 and closes on Wednesday, 27th May 2020.

The Philanthropy Fund - 'Innovate Together' is a collaboration between Government, philanthropists and social innovations. It will focus on **supporting innovative responses** to the Covid-19 crisis.

€70,000 COVID-19 RESPONSE FUND FOR CONNEMARA, CO. GALWAY

SSE Renewables and Greencoat Renewables, joint owners of Galway Wind Park, have launched a €70,000 COVID-19 response fund to **support local communities** located within 10km of the facility.



The funding is **immediately** available and will support community groups that are currently mobilising a rapid response to support those most-in-need as a direct result of the impact of the Coronavirus outbreak.

WEB SUMMIT IS DONATING €1,000,000 TO CHANGEX

Web Summit, which employs 210 people in their Dublin HQ, is donating €1 million to the Covid-19 fight. This money will be donated to ChangeX, who will then identify, fund and spread projects aimed at strengthening Ireland's response to Covid-19. This funding will be allocated exclusively to Covid-19 projects. COVID-19-specific project submissions are already been accepted on the ChangeX website.

REVISED DEADLINE! THE IRISH HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUALITY COMMISSION HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUALITY GRANT SCHEME 2020-21

The **theme** of the Human Rights and Equality Grants Scheme for this year is empowering people (rightsholders) who face the greatest barriers **to justice to access their rights**.



The Scheme is **open to civil society organisations**, including community and voluntary organisations, trade unions, groups representing geographic communities addressing poverty and social exclusion or communities of interest protected under the 9 equality grounds including groups led by people with disabilities and ethnic minorities.

The closing date for applications is now 4pm, 19 May 2020.

NEIGHBOURLY COMMUNITY FUND

With the support of their partner businesses, M&S, Lidl, Aldi, Danone and Coca-Cola European Partners, Neighbourly are launching a series of micro-grants of up to £400, to support good causes that are helping communities affected by the new Coronavirus outbreak.



Grants will be awarded to *existing members of Neighbourly* in UK and Ireland whose work will involve supporting members of the community suffering economically, socially or from ill health as a result of the outbreak. This may include, but not be limited to, elderly people, those on low incomes and people at risk of food insecurity.

Grants are **unrestricted** and can go towards food provision, emergency supplies, practical support, running costs, transport and other essentials.


COUNTY GALWAY PPN 'PPN CONNECT' PROJECT

Galway Co PPN announces the launch of its 'PPN Connect' Project. With social distancing making it harder for us to connect and to continue our work to help and support community groups we have adapted and are pleased to launch this new project.

What is it? The PPN Connect Project is a series of activities to connect groups and offer support.

The project comprises 3 main activities:

- An online discussion forum hosted by the Galway Co PPN with members to share experiences, discuss challenges and collectively find solutions and consider community engagement in the future.
- 2) An **information brief** will be sent out that focuses on methods of fundraising during Covid-19, volunteer engagement, group management and FAQs addressing matters affecting Community groups.


