'Galway 2020 European Capital of Culture' Opening Ceremonies, was highlighted and promoted to the general public – they took place from 02-02-2020 to 08-02-2020, at various locations.

Cyber Fraud Crime – Safer Internet Day – 11-02-20:

Galway Co. Council's Joint Policing Sub-Committee 'Education & Awareness' made the general public aware of 'Safer Internet Day' (SID) which took place on Tuesday, 11th February, '20, by promoting it on Social Media and on the Council's website. Safer Internet Day aimed to promote the safe and positive use of digital technology, especially among children and young people. It is an initiative of the European Commission.

In conjunction with this Sub-Committee, Sergeant Peadar Ryan dedicated the weekly Garda Radio Slot on the Keith Finnegan Show 'Galway Talks' on Galway Bay FM, to the topic of 'Safer Internet Day 2020' on that day.

The slogan of the Safer Internet Day 'Together for a Better Internet' was highlighted along with the impact it has on Children & Young People, Parents & Carers, Teachers & Educators. Sergeant Ryan spoke about the safer use of the internet for all users, young and old alike and also delivered advice under the headings of Phishing & Invoice Fraud.

Road Safety – 'Be Safe, Be Seen' – 12-02-20:

On behalf of the JPC Sub Committee, Galway Co. Council issued a Tweet 'Be Safe, Be Seen' advising the general public that the following High Visibility Material was available free of charge at the Council offices, courtesy of the Road Safety Authority:- adult and children vests/ armbands/ bike lights/ reflective bibs, rucksack covers and string bags. There was a big take-up on this worthy initiative.

<u>'Personal Safety & Home Security' – 27-02-20:</u>

Members of the Community Policiing Unit and AIB Bank held an Information Briefing in Cregg Community Centre which advised older persons on the topics of personal safety and home security.

'Community Response Forum' – 06-04-20:

The Council's COVID-19 Community Response Forum promoted this initiative on social media and provided the relevant contact details to members of the Galway community.

'Road Safety Awareness - Cyclists' – 05-05-20:

Due to the increased numbers of cyclists on Galway Roads during COVID-19, the JPC Community appealed to motorists to reduce their speeds and to share the roads with these vulnerable road users.

<u>'Stay Safe – COVID-19' – 18-05-20:</u>

Using Social Media, the JPC Sub Committee appealed to the general public to 'Stay Safe - Stay Strong – Stay Separate', during the COVID-19 pandemic.

'Road Safety Message – Drinking & Driving' – 12-06-20:

A Road Safety Message appealing to motorists 'Don't Drive and Drive' was promoted due the summer months.

'Road Safety Message – Back to School' – 31-08-20:

The Sub-Committee reminded motorists, cyclists and children to take extra care on Galway roads as schools returned. The public was reminded that traffic would increase, buses would be picking up / leaving off children, children would be walking and cycling to and from schools, and parents would be driving their children to school before heading to work. Therefore, the advice given was to 'SLOW DOWN' when travelling near a school - it is never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when children are on the roads and to always expect the unexpected.

Bike Week 2020 – 19th to 27th September, '20:



With COVID-19 restrictions, many people rediscovered cycling. During Bike Week 2020, the Sub-Committee reminded cyclists of the following:

• Always look and signal to show other road users what you plan to do, and make eye contact where possible so that you have been seen

- Always stop at red lights, and obey the Rules of the Road
- Avoid cycling up inside vehicles such as trucks, vans or buses. You will not be seen
- Always use lights on your bike when visibility is poor, and in the evening and at night
- Wear reflective or light coloured clothing when cycling during the day to increase your visibility
- Wear a fitted cycling helmet when cycling

<u>'Make Way Day' – 25th September, '20:</u>



The Council's Joint Policing Sub-Committee, Education & Awareness, advised of '**Make Way Day**' on 25th September, '20, all over Ireland. It is a national day of local action on accessibility. The public awareness campaign aims to highlight the issues people with disabilities face getting around their communities. "Hey, this blocks my way!" is the message. Examples of obstructions are parked cars on footpaths; bikes chained to railings; sandwich boards; overhanging branches, etc.

World Alzheimers Day – 21st September, '20:

The Council's Joint Policing Sub-Committee, Education & Awareness, advised of **'World Alzheimers Day'** on 21st September, '20. An Garda Síochána marked the event by promoting 'Be a Good Neighbour'.



European Cyber Security Month – October, '20:

European Cyber Security Month took place during the month of October, 2020. The Council's Joint Policing Sub-Committee, Education & Awareness, promoted the event on social media and advised the public to 'Think Before U Click', which was the official motto of the European Cyber Security Month. The programme focused on two themes to help people identify and be prepared for cyber threats. The first theme, 'Digital Skills', provided participants with information on e-privacy matters such as personal data protection, cyber bullying and cyber stalking. The second theme, 'Cyber Scams', shared insights into current and potential cyber threats such as phishing, business email compromise and online shopping fraud.

The EU Agency for Cybersecurity and its partners published reports, organised events and activities such as trainings, strategy summits, presentations and more.

Tips for Driving on Wet Roads:



Due to heavy rain in October, '20, the JPC Sub-Committee had the following advice on social media, for the general public:

- Drop your speed on wet roads to give yourself time to slow down, if needed.
- Avoid wet leaves these can be dangerous as standing water.
- Watch out for floodwater on bends if you don't know when you'll come out of the water, it might not be worth the risk of driving into it.
- Drive on the highest section of the road you can use the edge of the kerb as an indicator of the water's depth
- Maintain a slow steady speed as you drive through any water.
- Test your brakes as soon as you're out of the water


Lock it or Lose It Campaign:
