


PPN Members voice their opinion!

Ceramic items, Textiles

Gate Fee: €5 per Van/Car and Trailer

Service must be **booked via the Barna Recycling Waste** website before arriving at any of the sites.

Message from Covid-19 Stakeholder COVID Tracker App Communications Support

The COVID Tracker App has been downloaded over **1.2 million** times to date and is continuing to increase daily.

Face Coverings on Public Transport

Face coverings help prevent people who don't know they have the virus from spreading it to others. They should be worn anywhere it's difficult to stay 2m apart, like shops or public transport, or when visiting anyone who's more at risk. Since Monday 13th July, face coverings are **mandatory on public transport**, and in shops since 10th August.

You must wear a face covering when using public transport unless you:

- are under 13 years old
- have an illness, special needs or impairment that would make wearing or removing a face covering upsetting or uncomfortable

BOOK 'ACHILL PAINTERS' LAUNCHED BY POET JOHN F. DEANE.

Not yet a week launched - by renowned award-winning island poet John F. Deane - ACHILL PAINTERS by Menlough-native Mary J Murphy is being described by many as one of the best books ever written about Achill & certainly the most thorough ever compiled about Achill painters.

Covering the known history of artists in the Atlantic Arcadia, stretching back to 1834, the book has almost 300 pages with full-colour images throughout, took three years to do & has 360 books in its bibliography.

Founder of Poetry Ireland, Deane said that the book is "an aide-memoir, a treasure chest, a cornucopia, and a book that will be around for a very long time". Professor Diarmaid Ferriter has described the book as "a terrific achievement",




Use your LEGO to showcase local heritage


