What is the PPN?

The Galway County Public Participation Network (PPN) is a new platform on which the local community can engage with the Galway County Council. It forms the link between the Voluntary & Community, Social Inclusion and Environmental sectors and the local governing body.

Established in 2014 through the Local Government Reform Act 2014, the PPN ensures that the public can have their say on local government decisions. The Galway County PPN currently has over 1000 member groups. A Directory of our members is available here. The PPN also works to a) inform communities of events and funding available.

b) educate groups and organisations via trainings and workshops to support their community work and,

c) represent their interests and ensure the 'community voice' is heard in local decision-making processes.

The main reason the PPNs were set up is to enable community groups to be represented and to feed into local government decision-making in a way that is fair, clear and respectful. The PPNs have three main areas of interest, also called 'Colleges':



How does PPN Work?

The PPN has a 'flat structure' not a hierarchical one meaning there is no one leader making final decisions but instead each group represented has an equal voice and opportunity to make decisions and to be heard and they do this during the Plenary meetings.

Representatives are elected by PPN members to sit on committees and are supported by linkage or working groups to carry out their role. The PPN has a team of workers to support its work which is directed by an annual Work Plan. A Secretariat, which is a group of elected PPN members, oversees the running of the PPN. The Secretariat members can be seen and contacted here. The PPN Plenary (meaning all member groups) is the main decision-making body of the PPN. A plenary meeting is convened annually to discuss issues and vote on policies and procedures. Each member group has one vote at a plenary.



How do I join PPN? (Register here)

Registering is free and easily accessible via our PPN Website.

Membership of the PPN is open to ALL community & voluntary groups within County Galway which meet the following criteria: Have a written constitution, some form of operating rules & procedures and hold regular meetings. Be in existence for at least 6 months and open to new members. Have a formal structure e.g. Chairperson, Secretary or equivalent. Be non-party political, non-sectarian and non-discriminatory.

Examples of the types of Groups: Residents Associations; Tidy towns; Family Resource Centres; Sports clubs/groups; Youth Groups; Environmental Groups; Art groups; Single based issue groups.

The Secretariat:

The PPN Secretariat is an important part of the PPN. It is the administrative arm and takes its direction from the Plenary (all of the Member Groups). The Secretariat is made up of Member Group representatives from each of the three Colleges (Community and Voluntary, Social Inclusion and Environmental). The role of the Secretariat is to makes sure that the decisions taken by the Plenary, the operational decision-making body of the PPN, are carried out. They also oversee the implementation of the Strategic Plan. If the Secretariat needs to make operational decisions between Plenary meetings, they then must be approved (ratified) by the Plenary at the next Plenary meeting. We have one secretariat member per Municipal District and 2 secretariat members representing the PPN pillars.

Introduction

Galway County Public Participation Network ('PPN') is an independent umbrella network of community & voluntary, environmental and social inclusion groups active within the county (excluding the city). The PPN is hosted by Galway County Council.

Public Participation Networks (PPNs) were established by the Irish government under the Local Government (Reform) Act 2014 to be the main link through which the Local Authority connects with these groups.

Galway County PPN is governed by the PPN Secretariat, a voluntary board elected from the wider PPN membership. The Secretariat oversee the development of the network and ensure that the objectives of the PPN are met. The Secretariat are supported by one full time coordinator ('Resource Worker') and a full-time Support Worker who manage the day-to-day running of the PPN. A part-time administrator is responsible for sending out emails, updating the PPN database and new registering groups.


Funding for the PPN is provided by both the Department of Rural and Community Development and by Galway County Council through an annual budget allocation (see SLA for details).

Government guidelines outline 3 main objectives for PPNs:

- Facilitate the participation and representation of communities in a fair, equitable and transparent manner through the environmental, social inclusion, community and voluntary sectors on decision making bodies.
- Educate and strengthen the capacity of communities and of the environmental, social inclusion, community and voluntary groups to contribute
 positively to the community in which they reside/participate.

2. Influencing Policy

PPN Reps;

PPN Representatives perform an important function on behalf of the PPNs. They are elected by Member Groups in their College / area to represent the PPN on Local Authority Boards or Committees on behalf of the PPN. In doing this, they represent the PPN Plenary, their own Municipal District / area, and their College. This is a critical role for the PPNs as Representatives provide the "PPN voice at the table".





5. Meetings and Events



On Tuesday 27th September 2022 Galway County PPN held its first in-person Plenary event since the Covid Pandemic.

The members of the Galway County PPN were asked to attend the meeting in the Claregalway Hotel and vote on a change to the PPN Constitution based on a Circular issued by the Department for Rural and Community Development. The Amendment addressed the voting procedure at PPN Plenaries where there is a lack of a Quorum in attendance. The Amendment was passed and will be included in the Galway County PPN Constitution.

Next, the Members were asked to adopt the PPN Workplan and Budget and ratify PPN Representatives nominated by PPN member groups to sit on the LCDC and Climate Change and Biodiversity SPC. The operational documents were approved and the 9 representatives were ratified by the members present. After a short break, the Plenary heard presentations about an energy efficiency training course that the PPN will run with Clar Éifeachteacht Fuinnimh, from AMACH, Community Finance Ireland and about LocalHub a new app to connect communities.



8. The Cathaoirleach's Awards




Participation
