

The Minister for the Environment, Climate and Communications, has signed new legislation which means that every household will be provided with a brown bin for food waste and light garden waste by their waste collector.

These changes mean households will be able to access a waste collection service to segregate their waste, minimise the amount of waste that goes to landfill, and reuse waste through measures such as recycling, composting or anaerobic digestion. From January 2024, every household in Ireland will be entitled to a brown bin collection service.



National Heritage Week 2024 Theme

To whom it may concern

The National Transport Authority (NTA) has today published the BusConnects Galway New

The new network, which forms a key part of the overall BusConnects Galway Programme, is intended to transform the public transport network across the Galway Metropolitan Area. The new network will involve the creation of new bus routes and improved bus frequencies to help transform the public transport network to meet anticipated growth and future demand in the region.

During 2022, the NTA carried out an extensive process of public consultation and review, in collaboration with Galway City Council, Galway County Council, Bus Éireann, City Direct and with specialised experience of transport designers Jarrett Walker and Associates. In April 2023, a draft new network was published, and the feedback and submissions have informed the Final New Bus Network published today.

Chapter 4 of the New Bus Network Report sets out the key changes that have been made to the network in each section of the city following the feedback received during the public consultation process. There remains roads in Galway City, such a Scircular Road, where we would have had liked to provide a bus service but where this is not possible due to inadequate road widths for two-way bus operation. Bus services can be added subsequently should the width issues be resolved.

Key changes within the New Galway Bus Network Report include:

- Concerns were raised during the public consultation process about the possible removal of services from Mervue Shopping Centre. To address these concerns, the NTA plans that the shopping centre can be served at the same bus stop as in the existing network, but by a different route. Route 3 was revised to provide a bus service on Parnell Avenue and Clarke Avenue in Mervue.
- There were a small number of submissions on the network that welcomed a proposed route through Bun a Chnoic and Cnoc an Oir. However, many respondents objected to the proposal, noting traffic and safety concerns. The NTA will work with Galway City Council to develop a bus-only street connection in Bun an Chnoic, or north of Bun an Chnoic, to allow service on Letteragh and Rahoon Roads.
- Many people objected to the removal of the bus service on a section of Upper Salthill Road, between Kingston Road and Knocknacarra Road, which is currently served by Routes 402 and 424. The NTA has revised Route 7 to serve this section of Upper Salthill Road.
- Negative feedback was received regarding the proposed removal of a bus service on Kingston Road, between Threadneedle Road and Knocknacarra Road. Kingston Road is currently served by Route 402. Route 10A has been adjusted to serve Kingston Road, connecting it to Salthill.

- Requests were received to extend Route 10 further into Oranmore so as to serve new residential development in Oranhill as well as the Lidl supermarket on Main Street. The NTA has extended bus services to the Lidl supermarket.
- There were many requests for a bus service on Circular Road. The NTA considers that
 Circular Road is currently too narrow, presenting a risk that service interruptions
 would arise affecting passengers on Circular Road and the sections of the route before
 and after. The NTA will work with Galway City Council to explore the possibility of a
 bus stop and turnaround for peak-only Route 4 buses at the new secondary school
 just west of the Upper Newcastle Road/Thomas Hynes Road junction. This could bring
 half hourly peak service within walking distance of the north end of Circular Road.

The NTA plans to commence implementation of the New Galway Bus Network between 2025 and 2026. It will be supported by a comprehensive public information campaign for bus users as the services are implemented.

DEPOSIT/RETURN SCHEME

Ireland will soon be introducing a Deposit Return Scheme.

From February 2024, when you buy a drink in a plastic bottle, aluminium or steel can that feature the Re-turn Logo, you pay a deposit in addition to the price of the drink. When you return your empty, undamaged container to any participating retail outlet, you get your deposit back in full.

BROWN BIN RECYCLING ROLL OUT

New legislation, coming into effect in January 2024, means all householders in Ireland will be entitled to a brown bin recycling collection service from their waste collector. See mywaste.ie for further details and FAQs.

The roll out of Brown Bins to all customers may take some time to complete, but customers should contact their service provider in the first instance.

CIVIC AMENITY SITES IN CO. GALWAY

Galway County Council currently operate Civic Amenity sites in Tuam, Clifden and Ballinasloe for householders within the functional area of Galway County Council.

A wide range of materials are accepted at these sites such as paint, waste electrical goods, household medicines, chemicals, engine oil, oil filters, timber, mattresses, furniture, plastics, carpets, lino, flat glass, and scrap metal.
