

National Broadband Plan

The National Broadband Plan (NBP) aims to ensure that every home, school and business in Ireland – regardless of how remote or rural – has access to high speed broadband.

This is being achieved through a combination of **Commercial investment** across the country (the **blue areas** of the Broadband Map)

a State Intervention in those areas where commercial operators acting alone are unlikely to invest (the Amber Areas of the Broadband Map) NBI are the company appoint to deliver these services. NBI has set up a website with information on their service delivery plans, they have a section where persons can be kept up to date with projected delivery dates of service in their area using their Eircode and email address.

The <u>National Broadband map</u> which is available on the <u>Gov.ie Interactive Map</u> site identifies locations and premises as being AMBER or BLUE, you can search this map using your Eircode, *if you don't know your Eircode you can use this <u>Eircode Finder tool</u>.*

The Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE) is actively monitoring the rollout of high-speed broadband in the BLUE areas so as to ensure the accuracy of the Map. If your house or business is in a BLUE area and you do not have access to high speed broadband, please follow the steps outlined below:

Check if your premises is located in an amber or blue area by either:

Entering your Eircode or Entering your address in the search box or Zooming in on the map.

If your premises is in a BLUE area: You can run a line speed check using <u>www.speedtest.net</u> or similar speed test web sites, If your speed checks are consistently below 30Mbps, you need to:

Check with ALL operators in your area to see if you can get high speed broadband.

If you cannot get a high speed broadband service, you need to contact the Department through the dedicated portal https://secure.dccae.gov.ie/forms/NBP-Customer-Service.aspx . Include your Eircode, a copy of your line speed check results and confirmation of the operators you have contacted.

The Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE) will then correspond with you directly on the NBP and how it is envisaged a high speed Broadband service is envisage to be delivered to your Eircode.

Wireless broadband

A full list of licenced **Wireless** broadband suppliers for County Galway can be found on the <u>ComReg website</u>, by typing Galway into the search bar and pressing search.

Mobile phone signal-

Persons can check the expected mobile coverage in their area by reviewing the coverage maps on the <u>ComReg website</u> by typing your Eircode or address into the search bar and pressing search, this web site provides a map of the expected mobile coverage (e.g. 3G,4G) in their area.

Mobile signal as shown on the **ComReg** website can differ from what is available on the ground due to the topography of the surrounding land and when measured indoors.

If poor mobile signal is main experienced indoors, you may wish to consider a mobile repeater, this is an electronic device that can be used to improve indoor coverage of mobile phone services like calls, texts and data, more information mobile repeaters can be fund here.

Contacting the Department of Communications

The Department of Communications has put in place a system to allow members of the public to contact them directly for queries relating to broadband and its delivery. Due to nature and extent of the information required, and GDPR guidelines, this is now the recommended channel for raising queries of this nature and can be accessed via the link below.



Green Dog Walkers Scheme

Pro-actively changing attitudes about dog fouling in Co. Galway

Educating and influencing the behaviour of dog owners regarding dog fouling will be to the fore as Galway County Council launch the "Green Dog Walkers Scheme" as an addition to its on-going Anti-Dog Fouling Campaign. The campaign continues to emphasise that dog fouling is the responsibility of the dog owner/walker and that they must clean up after their dog.

Dog owners and dog walkers in Co. Galway are invited to register as "Green Dog Walkers" in this scheme.

The Green Dog Walkers scheme is a positive, pro-active, non -confrontational, friendly way to change attitudes about dog fouling in Co. Galway. The programme has been rolled out in many parts of Ireland and has proven very successful. The scheme consists of dog owners and dog walkers committing to clean up after their dog, and to being a friendly reminder to other dog walkers to clean up after their dog, while at no time being aggressive or confrontational about the issue. An information leaflet about the scheme and a pledge form are available.

What does it mean when you sign up?

When you sign up to the scheme you will be sent a complimentary Green Dog Walkers high-viz vest and a 'doggie bone' poop-bag dispenser with a roll of bags.

By signing up to the scheme you have 'Taken the Pledge' to always clean up after your dog, to carry extra doggie bags and to gladly give others a bag for their dog if they ask for one. By wearing the Green Dog Walkers high-viz vest you are indicating that you are a responsible dog-owner participating in and supporting the Green Dog Walkers scheme, and a contact for others who might want information about the scheme.

We encourage everyone to support the campaign as this will make it more effective. Higher participation will lead to a greater impact in tackling the dog fouling problem in our county. Most dog owners are very responsible but there are instances of dog fouling on our streets and in green spaces, and it is detrimental to the health of all. It is very upsetting for the public when the dog waste goes on shoes, wheelchairs or buggies!


































The Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications is now seeking Expressions of Interest for participants in the 2024-25 Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) Champions Programme.

As part of the 2024-2025 programme, a number of organisations and groups from across the country will be appointed 'SDG Champions' to help raise awareness of the importance of the SDGs as the cornerstone of a fair, prosperous and sustainable future for all. As Champions, they will show through their own actions that everyone in society can make a contribution to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The SDGs, also known as the Global Goals, were adopted by the United Nations in 2015 as a universal call to action to end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure that by 2030 all people could enjoy peace and prosperity. There are 17 SDGs, covering areas such as poverty, shelter, education, health gender equality and clean energy. Thank you for considering participating in this research project. The purpose of this document is to explain to you what the work is about and what your participation would involve, enabling you to make an informed choice.


The purpose of this study is to investigate the experiences of energy vulnerability in Ireland. Energy access is critical for maintaining good health and social well-being in the home. However, vulnerable groups face high costs and insufficient energy to meet their daily needs. In light of the current energy crisis, there is a growing interest in understanding how the energy vulnerable experience and cope with limited energy access. However, most policies aimed at the energy vulnerable have relied on evidence based on quantitative data, which fails to account for lived energy experiences and thus fails to effectively address the problem of energy vulnerability in reland to help to inform and improve public policy. You will be aked about your lived energy experience, such as your energy use, energy needs, challenges and

If you choose to participate, you will be asked to participate in a one-to-one interview with the researcher, complete a survey and keep a diary for at least a month. This interview will be audio recorded and is expected to take &0-40 minutes to complete.

Participation in this study is entirely voluntary. There is no obligation to participate, and should you choose to do so, you can refuse to answer specific questions, decide to withdraw from the interview or not keep a diary, or complete the survey. Once the interview, survey, and diary keeping have been concluded, you can withdraw up to two weeks from the completion of interviews and surveys and submission of diaries.

All the information you provide will be kept confidential and anonymous and available only to the researcher and supervision team. If there is a risk of harm, the researcher will provide contacts to reach out to. Once the interview is completed, the recording will immediately be transferred to UCC-Supplied Microsoft Products like OneDrive and Teams storage platform and wiped from the recording device.

The researcher will transcribe the interview, removing all identifying information. Unce this is done, the recording will also be deleted, and only the anonymized transcript will remain. This will be stored on a UCC-Supplied Microsoft OneDrive and Teams using the researcher's UCC credentials. Any physical documents, such as consent forms, will be converted to electronic format. Any physical documents will be held in locked cabinets in the offices of the researcher's department. The data will be securely stored for a minimum of ten years.



Claudia Hihetah (chihetah@ucc.ie), a doctoral researcher in UCC, is conducting research which aims to document the lived experiences of energy vulnerability in Ireland in order to help inform and improve policy. The interview will be audio recorded and is expected to take 30-40 minutes to complete. Participation in this study is completely voluntary. There is no obligation to participate, and should you choose to do so, you can refuse to answer specific questions or decide to withdraw from the study prior to completing any of the activities. You do not have to complete all the activities. All information you provide will be confidential, and your anonymity will be protected throughout the study.
